The idea being that golfers will play more towards the left and we avoid errant balls on the Greens Shed, or the car park or the Clubhouse.

It's been good to see that the pace of play policy "POPP" is already having a positive impact on competition days. Well done to all those involved with its development and introduction, in particular Nic Hall and Phil Lyons and the rest of the G&M Committee.
