Smoking Area:

There have been complaints about members and visitors smoking and using e-cigarettes in areas where smoking and using e-cigarettes is banned under the NSW Smoke-free Laws (https://www.health.nsw.gov.au/tobacco/Pages/smoke-free-laws.aspx). No smoking areas around the clubhouse and Greenkeeper's sheds are clearly marked. A designated smoking area has been established at the bench seat under the Norfolk Pine to the south of the Clubhouse.

Kitchen/bar Access:

Access to the kitchen/bar area is strictly for staff/volunteers who are working in those areas. Some members are regularly entering the kitchen/bar area to return dirty dishes and/or get ice from the ice machine. While these members are undoubtedly trying to assist kitchen and bar staff, unauthorised access presents several safety risks.

Corner of Staples Street and Scott Street.

Members are advised that when driving out of the Club we should give way to any traffic turning from Scott Street north into Staples Street and vice versa. We are currently investigating the status of this small section of road in regard to traffic compliance. In the meantime, be alert.

Volunteers needed!!!!

As you may be aware the Clubhouse bar is run primarily by members who do so voluntarily.

With the success of our Links 19 Restaurant the bar volunteers often take food and beverage orders at the food counter as well as taking drink orders at the bar. In busy times this can become quite onerous, to the point where some of our bar volunteers feel overwhelmed and no longer want to do bar shifts.

One possible way of overcoming this would be to have additional volunteers who take on the role of taking the food and beverage orders at the food counter in the busy part of each day. These volunteers may also help with the collection of plates etc. from the Clubhouse and verandah. The shifts would be two to three hours in length starting at around 11am depending on how busy the day might be.

In the not-too-distant future, parts of the kitchen will be upgraded to exceed our food premises requirements and will mean that the normal full kitchen services will not be available for one or two days. Members will be informed more at a later date.

Once more with the extreme rainfall our region has experienced, many other courses will be closed, possibly for quite a while in some cases. In 2021 and 2023 we averaged 125 players per day which grew to 160 per day when the other courses are closed in 2022.

As expected, playing numbers are already increasing and with courses saturated it could be extra busy all through the cooler winter days when drying out will become an issue. The Pro Shop will follow our normal principles in that the timesheets will open 15 days prior at 6 pm to our members and 7 days prior at 1pm to our visitors. We have many on-going arrangements with a variety of groups that have long supported us and

are an integral part of the successful running the Club. These long-term visitors and travelling groups staying in accommodation are excused from this rule being able to book in more than two weeks out, while the long- term visitors are able to book 14 days out when the Pro Shop opens in the morning.

For these coming few months it is essential that members take advantage and book in during the first week when the timesheets are open, to avoid disappointment. This includes social play (including Gold members), don't just turn up expecting to play on the day, check first.
